

TERRY RAKES MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP
SUPPORTED BY SQUARE D COMPANY – COLUMBIA PLANT
\$1,000 AWARD
LINN STATE TECHNICAL COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES

Terry Rakes was a highly skilled tool and die maker for Square D Company, Columbia Plant and a 1978 graduate of Linn State's Machine Tool Technology program. The scholarship is awarded each year to a deserving student enrolled at Linn State Technical College who most exemplifies the individual qualities and high degree of craftsmanship exhibited by Mr. Rakes in the tool and die trade.

The scholarship applies toward the costs associated with a student's education including, but not limited to, incidental fees (tuition), books, lab fees, tools, housing, etc. Eligibility is determined by the individual's intent to pursue a career as a tool and die maker.

Selection is based on the student's aptitude and ability to apply their trade with skill and strong work values. Character, leadership and civic involvement are also important traits. Financial need is also a consideration.

MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY

Full-time Machine Tool Technology Student (First year or second year student maintaining at least 12 college credit hrs. per semester).

APPLICATION PROCESS

Only full-time students pursuing an associate of applied science degree in Machine Tool Technology are eligible.

Requested information must be submitted along with the scholarship application.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Deadline for application to assure consideration for the upcoming academic year is **February 15**. Applicants must follow the procedures outlined below. Applicants will be notified of the status of their application as soon as the scholarship selection committee reaches a decision.

- A. Complete the Linn State Technical College Admissions Application.
- B. Forward a copy of your high school transcript or official GED score report.
- C. Take the ACT assessment test as early as possible and request that your scores be sent to Linn State Technical College, or take the COMPASS Test on the LSTC campus.
- D. Complete the online Scholarship Application (including personal goal statement).

- E. Three letters of recommendation and any additional documents may be forwarded to:

EXPECTATIONS OF SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENT

- A. Upon accepting the scholarship, the student agrees to remain enrolled on a full-time basis (minimum of 12 college credit hours), attend classes regularly, model appropriate behavior and maintain satisfactory academic standing. In the event the student initially awarded the scholarship is unable to fulfill the requirement of full-time enrollment for the fall semester, the scholarship will be awarded to the next available selection.

- B. Release of Information. In submitting application, the applicant or applicant's legal guardian grants authority for release of information contained in the application packet for use by Linn State Technical College and Midcoast Aviation in promoting or publicizing the scholarship. If selected, the recipient agrees to participate in ceremonies hosted to honor annual scholarship winners.
- C. If selected, the recipient agrees to send a thank-you letter to the scholarship sponsor. Thank you letters must be submitted to the Foundation Office at Linn State Technical College no later than one month after award is announced.
- D. In the event the student initially awarded the scholarship is unable to fulfill the requirement of full-time enrollment for the fall semester, the scholarship will be awarded to the next available selection.
- E. The scholarship recipient is expected to participate in ceremonies hosted at the Square D Plant in Columbia, Missouri. By completing the application, the recipient of the scholarship gives consent to the release of information for purposes of promoting the scholarship.
